# Keeping safe online



## Why is the internet a good tool?

- You can use it to learn lots of things.
- You can have lots of fun watching videos and playing games.
- It can help with our schoolwork.
- You can stay in touch with friends and family.

## Why can the internet be dangerous sometimes?

- Cyber Bullying—nasty messages and comments, swearing and unkind words. • Not everybody on the internet is kind.
- Stranger Danger— • People on the internet can pretend that they are someone else. We should only talk to people online if we know them in real life.
- Bad Language—Sometimes when we are online, we can see or hear swear words that might upset us.
- Content Online—some material online is not suitable for children to look at and have age restrictions.
- Computer viruses - sometimes people will ask you to click on something that might give your device a virus.
- People could ask for personal information, which is dangerous.
- Truth - sometimes people put things on the internet which are fake or untrue.

## How do people access the internet?

- Computer/ laptop or Chromebook.
- Ipad / tablet
- Phone
- Games consoles (Playstation, Xbox, Switch)
- TV
- Smart Watches
- Alexa / Google Dot etc

## What is E-safety?

- E-Safety means electronic safety.
- E-Safety is important because it helps us stay safe and enjoy being online.

## Why do we need an E-safety Policy?

- To keep us safe on the Internet in school and at home.
- To make sure we know what to do when something strange occurs or when we are worried.

**THINK, THEN CLICK!**

E-Safety rules for Key Stage 2:

1. We ask permission before using the Internet.
2. We only use websites that an adult has chosen.
3. We tell an adult if we see anything we are uncomfortable with.
4. We immediately close any web-page we are not sure about.
5. We only e-mail people an adult has approved.
6. We send emails that are polite and friendly.
7. We never give out personal information or passwords.
8. We never arrange to meet with anyone we don't know.
9. We do not open e-mails sent by anyone we don't know.
10. We do not use Internet chatrooms.

## If people online are mean or worry me: What should I do?

- Tell an adult I trust straight away. Report anything that worries you.
- Try to stay calm.
- Try to ignore the person.
- Block and delete the person after telling a trusted adult - Keep all messages for evidence.

## What shouldn't I do?

- Do not keep worries to yourself.
- Do not be unkind or nasty back.
- Try not to get angry or upset.
- Do not delete messages.

## Who can I talk to?

You can talk to any adult in school.

- Mrs Hallam or Miss Williams
- Miss Davies - in charge of internet safety.
- Teachers
- Teaching Assistants
- Miss Jenkins in the office
- Breakfast club and lunchtime Staff
- PC Diana Boyt (police school officer).
- You can also talk to a trusted family member at home.

## How do we keep pupils safe?

- We work with the council ICT team to keep everyone safe.
- We have software that keep viruses away
- We have Internet filters and searching safe on Google to keep pupils from seeing inappropriate content
- We keep access to i-Pads and Laptops secure
- We keep our network and Wi-Fi access secure
- All staff have training to help keep children safe on the Internet.
- We report and take action if there is an e-safety issue.
- We make parents aware of internet safety advice.
- We talk to parents if there is an e-safety issue.

**THINK, THEN CLICK!**

These rules help us to stay safe on the Internet:

1. We only use the Internet when an adult is with us.
2. We can only click on buttons or links when we know what they do.
3. We can search the Internet with an adult.
4. We always ask if we get lost on the Internet.
5. We can send and open e-mails together.
6. We can write polite and friendly e-mails to people that we know.
